2012 KRCC Work Program

The Board requested that work on inter-jurisdictional cost efficiencies, along with development of strategies pertaining to the KRCC 2012 Legislative Agenda, be added to the [2012 Work Program](#).

Organizational Finances

The [2012 Budget](#), [Member Agency Dues](#), and Executive [Management Services Contract Extension](#), were approved as presented.

Legislative Priorities: 2012

During their Study Session, the Board hosted our State Legislators for a productive discussion concerning legislative issues. After their discussion, the Board adopted the 2012 Legislative Agenda ~ a broad framework of [five key legislative issues](#). The Board expects to remain in dynamic dialogue with our Legislators throughout the upcoming session, January 9 —March 8th, 2012.

Countywide Planning Policies

Kitsap County's [Countywide Planning Policies](#) Adoption Process continues through December following the Nov. 14 Kitsap County approval of the revised CPPs. The policies are now with the Cities and Tribes for ratification.

SKIA: WA Dept. of Corrections ~ Essential Public Facility Siting

Bremerton is 1 of 3 sites under consideration for a WA DoC Intake Facility at the South Kitsap Industrial Area. The Board reviewed a proposal that the WA DoC be "excused" from the CPP Element G siting process, based on the extent of site evaluation & public outreach/input that has already been conducted as part of the project EIS. [Element G of the Countywide Planning Policies calls for the KRCC to convene a special siting evaluation committee to make sure that all project impacts have been identified and addressed.] The Board declined the proposal and asked for more information about the siting process to date.

Transportation

This autumn, each WA County (through Metropolitan Planning Organizations e.g. Puget Sound Regional Council and Rural Transportation Planning Organizations e.g. Peninsula RTPO) was asked to create an illustrative list of priority projects for a potential revenue package in the 2012 Legislative Session. At this Board meeting, the KRCC Board "remanded" the [proposed Kitsap priority list of projects](#) to the KRCC TransPOL for further review and possible revision. TransPOL & TransTAC will convene for discussion of the list on Tuesday, November 29, 4:00–5:00 p.m. at Norm Dicks Gov't Center, Council Conference Room.
