Countywide Planning Policies

The revised Countywide Planning Policies are now in effect! The CPPs have been adopted by Kitsap County and ratified by the Cities of Poulsbo, Port Orchard and Bainbridge Island, and the Suquamish and Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribes. Copies of the final CPPs will be distributed and available on the KRCC website within the week.

Element G: Siting Essential Public Facilities (EPF)

The Board passed two resolutions stating that: (1) Any EPF proposed in Kitsap County that has been evaluated through its own siting process by a state or regional authority is not required to comply with CPP Element G (Resolution 2012-01. [Click to view](#)); and (2) During the next update of the CPPs, Element G shall be amended to reflect updates to the WAC (Resolution 2012-02. [Click to view](#)).

Federal Transportation Funding

This spring KRCC will distribute \$9.89 million in federal transportation funding for road improvement projects in Kitsap. KRCC will also develop a set of projects for submission to a regional competition for federal funds distributed by the Puget Sound Regional Council. KRCC's Transportation Policy Committee and Technical Advisory Committee will work closely to develop recommendations for KRCC Board approval in the coming months.
