A. Welcome and Administration

Sophie Glass, facilitator of the KRCC Transportation Technical Advisory Committee (TransTAC), welcomed the group and reviewed the meeting's agenda (See Attachment A for a list of participants).

TransTAC approved their December 9, 2021 TransTAC meeting summary.

B. Regional Project Evaluation Committee (RPEC) and other PSRC Updates

TransTAC members provided an updated on the Rural Town Centers and Corridors (RTCC) competition. Presentations occurred on January 14, 2022, and the RTCC meeting will be on January 26.

The Transportation Policy Board recommended that the PSRC Policy Framework for Federal Funds be forwarded to the Executive Board for approval. Dates for the Regional Transportation Competition will be on the agenda at the next RPEC meeting, and PSRC will be able to share dates for the Regional Competition soon.

Other updates included freight funding sources as part of the WSDOT National Highway Freight Program and the Draft Regional Transportation Plan, which was released for public review on January 13. There will be a 45-day public engagement and review period, and the final plan is due to be adopted in March.

Jennifer Barnes, PSRC, shared an update on the progress reports submitted by TransTAC members at the end of 2021. PSRC will report out at the next TransTAC meeting.

C. Regional and Countywide Competition

KRCC staff will send out Countywide Screening Forms to TransTAC when the Call for Projects goes out in February.

TransTAC reviewed the Draft 2022 Countywide Call for Projects and shared the following:

- A track changes version showing the difference between the 2020 and 2022 Countywide Call for Projects would be helpful to highlight the changes between the two documents. KRCC staff will create a track changes version to share with TransPOL at their upcoming meeting on January 20.
- TransTAC discussed the issue of capping funding requests at half of all funds or half of the funds allocated to Capacity, Safety, and Retrofit projects. TransTAC was split on the issue and TransPOL will make a recommendation at their January 20 meeting.
- TransTAC discussed the updates to the Equity criteria and Safety and Security criteria and made the following comments/suggestions:
 - *Equity:* It is fine that transit is not listed in the criteria, but projects should consider the role of transit in addressing equity.
 - Safety and Security: Added capacity language to "Criteria A: Support for regional and countywide centers and the corridors that serve them."
- The Call for Projects needs greater clarity regarding funding eligibility for Countywide Growth Centers, Candidate Countywide Growth Centers, and local centers as outlined in the Countywide Planning Policies.
- KRCC staff will add maps of Countywide Growth Centers and Candidate Countywide Growth Centers to the Draft 2022 Countywide Call for Projects.
- KRCC Staff will present four options to TransPOL around implementing a cap on the number of Countywide Competitions applications: 1) No action (currently what exists, 2) Limiting the number of applications to 3-4 projects per jurisdiction with no limit on the contingency list, 3) Limiting the number of applications to 3-4 projects per jurisdiction with one additional project for Kitsap County and Kitsap Transit to fulfill rural requirements, and 4) Limiting the number of applications.
 - \circ $\,$ TransTAC presented option 2 as the majority recommendation ^1 to TransPOL in November.
 - TransTAC suggested that TransPOL determine if partnership projects would take up an allocated slot for each jurisdiction.

TransTAC members shared potential Regional and Countywide Competition projects. Most jurisdictions were still waiting to identify and select the projects that will move forward. Members discussed the following projects:

- Kitsap Transit's SR 107 project may be a potential Regional Project.
- The City of Poulsbo will put forward another segment of the Noll Corridor.
- The City of Poulsbo, Kitsap County, and Kitsap Transit will coordinate for a potential multijurisdictional application for the 307/104 corridors.
- Kitsap Transit may submit the Poulsbo Park and Ride.
- Kitsap Transit requested that jurisdictions submit requests for data as soon as possible.

D. Corridor Updates

No corridor updates were discussed.

E. Solutions and Support

Kitsap Transit shared that their Silverdale Transit Center project came in under the estimated cost, and other TransTAC members also shared that asphalt projects were also coming in under the estimated costs. Members were having issues with electrical, signal pole, and signal procurement.

F. Announcements and Next Steps

The 305 working group has a conflict for the February 10 TransTAC meeting. Pending PSRC availability, KRCC staff will reschedule the meeting for 12 - 2 p.m.

Mark Dorsey, City of Poulsbo, announced that Chris Hammer will be more involved over the next two months.

Poulsbo and Port Orchard were successful in the first round of screening for Transportation Improvement Benefits Complete Streets process.

G. Adjourn

1. How many projects can I submit to the Countywide Competition?

The table below outlines the number of projects each jurisdiction can submit. Any eligible KRCC member can appeal to the KRCC Executive Board to expand the number of projects to greater than 28 for a specific partnership project. This information can be found on pages 13-14 of the 2022 Countywide Call for Projects.

2. How much can I ask for in a single application?

A project sponsor may request up to 50% of the total available Surface Transportation Program (STP) funding, or \$5.21 million per project. This information can be found on page 4 of the 2022 Countywide Call for Projects.

3. What should I know about the contingency list for this cycle?

Following the Project Selection workshop, KRCC's TransTAC, TransPOL, and Executive Board will develop and approve a Contingency List that is 30-50% more than the expected funding. The Contingency List will be prioritized, at a minimum, to identify High, Medium, and Lower Priority Projects. This information can be found on pages 12-13 of the 2022 Countywide Call for Projects.

4. What happens if I submit a partnership project?

If a Port or Tribe chooses to submit a partnership project with a City, the County, or Kitsap Transit, this action would reduce the number of projects allocated to that City, the County or Kitsap Transit. A partnership is defined as an application submitted by a City, County, or Kitsap Transit with a Port or

Tribe with the flexibility of the applicants to decide the funding recipient, lead applicant, partner roles, and partner responsibilities. This information can be found on page 14 of the 2022 Countywide Call for Projects.

5. What are the main changes to the criteria?

The 2022 Call for Projects includes the following changes or updates to the project evaluation criteria:

- Criteria A. Support of Centers of Growth & the corridors that serve them: Added language to address capacity and concurrency level of services.
- *Criteria D. Equity considerations:* New criterion with language from 2022 Policy Framework for PSRC Federal Funds.
- Criteria E. Safety and security: Updated with new language from 2022 Policy Framework for PSRC Federal Funds. This section also includes language from the 2020 criterion, "Safety/capacity benefits."
- The Safety/capacity benefits criterion was deleted to eliminate redundancies with Criteria A, D, and E. Any language that does not overlap was added to those criteria.

6. What kind of Countywide Growth Centers are eligible for funding?

Countywide Growth Centers and <u>Candidate</u> Countywide Centers are both eligible for funding through the Countywide Competition. These centers are designated through the Kitsap Countywide Planning Policies. Please refer to each jurisdiction's Comprehensive Plan, sub-area plan, or other planning document to locate the boundary lines of each Countywide Growth Center or Candidate Countywide Growth Center. 7. Are local centers eligible for funding?

Local centers and the corridors that serve them are eligible for funding through the Countywide Competition. Project applicants need to demonstrate the designation of the local center in their respective Comprehensive Plan. Local Centers are distinct from Rural Centers (LAMIRDS), which are not eligible for transportation fundings. This information can be found on page 9 of the 2022 Countywide Call for Projects.

8. Where can I find maps of local centers?


Maps of Kitsap local centers can be found in each jurisdiction's individual Comprehensive Plan.

9. Is Naval Base Kitsap eligible to receive transportation funds?

NBK cannot be a project sponsor for the Countywide Competition or Regional Competition. However, <u>the corridors that serve</u> NBK's military installations identified in the CPPs (NBK-Bremerton, NBK-Jackson Park, NBK-Bangor, NBK-Keyport) are eligible for funding through the Countywide Competition if an eligible jurisdiction is a project sponsor. The <u>corridors that serve</u> NBK-Bremerton are eligible for funding through the Regional Competition if an eligible jurisdiction is a project sponsor. This information is available on page 8 of the 2022 Countywide Call for Projects.

10. What's the difference between Centers of Growth, Countywide Centers, and Countywide Growth Centers?


The 2021 Countywide Planning Policies created firmer definitions for terms that have been used throughout the previous transportation competition cycles. "Centers of Growth" are now the umbrella term for a variety of centers and Appendix C of the CPPs lists all the Centers of Growth. "Countywide Growth Centers" now have stricter criteria (see the 2018 Regional Centers Framework) but were previously just called "Countywide Centers." See the graphic below for how different center types are nested within the larger concept of Centers of Growth.
