A. Welcome and Administration

Claire Wendle, KRCC Transportation Program Lead, opened the meeting and welcomed participants to the first TransTAC meeting of 2023. See Attachment A for list of participants.

B. PSRC Updates

Kalon Thomas, PSRC, shared updates for Project Tracking and funding. PSRC has contacted sponsors with watchlisted projects for 2023. He shared the PSRC tracking report. PSRC is also soliciting requests for projects that do not anticipate meeting their 2023 delivery deadline. Project progress reports were due in November 2022.

Members of the PSRC Project Delivery Working Group (Kitsap County, Kitsap Transit, and Poulsbo) shared updates from the first working group meeting. The group discussed addressing supplemental funding and support for flexible and easy fund allocation for projects. They will look at how money can be allocated to projects quickly and will work to identify ways to refine the funding process.

PSRC received a grant for Safe Streets and Roads for All, which will be distributed among 6 cities in the Puget Sound region. A portion of the grant will be allocated to smaller local agencies. More information will be shared at the Regional Safety Conference in June.

C. Cross Jurisdictional Transportation Issues

TransTAC members participated in an activity to identify areas of common interest to guide meeting discussions for 2023. Members identified the following topics:

- Information and resources regarding jurisdiction updates to Comprehensive Plans and building codes.
- Opportunities for funding as a result of rebalancing, including a list of "off-the-shelf" projects and preservation projects.
- Monitoring the regional safety plan and differences between Kitsap County and state data.
- Tracking PSRC Safety and Equity definitions and the implications for the Countywide Competition.
- Discussing interjurisdictional projects for the 2024 PSRC Regional and Countywide Competition.
- Tracking the WSDOT Highways for Complete Streets requirement.

These topics will be reviewed at the March 16 TransPOL meeting.

D. Corridor Updates

TransTAC members shared updates on their respective projects, including construction updates, permitting and regulation processes, and funding opportunities.

Kitsap Transit shared that PSRC is creating a new tracking process for transit agencies because FTA funding has a longer obligation timeline.

E. Announcements and Next Steps

Claire Wendle reviewed the action items from the meeting and adjourned the group. The next TransTAC meeting will be held virtually on May 11. The next TransPOL meeting will be held virtually on March 16.
