A. Welcome & Approval of Draft March 8 Meeting Summary

Sophie Glass, facilitator of the KRCC Transportation Technical Advisory Committee (TransTAC), led introductions (see Attachment A for a list of participants). TransTAC approved their March 8, 2018 meeting summary and KRCC staff will post it to the KRCC website. TransTAC welcomed new participant Ed Winkley, WSDOT.

B. 2018 Countywide Competition

TransTAC agreed that project sponsors can present their Countywide Competition projects at the 4/19 TransPOL meeting through a verbal report out, hand out, and/or slides. Project sponsors should provide their slides and handouts to KRCC staff prior to the TransPOL meeting if possible.

TransTAC members discussed their proposed Regional Competition projects, indicating the name of project, phase, local/regional center served, project type and funding request.

TransTAC agreed to have KRCC staff provide the overview of Countywide projects on behalf of TransTAC at the May 1 Board meeting.

C. Regional Competition

Regional Project Sponsors reported that the presentations to the PSRC Regional Project Evaluation Committee will be 15 minutes and allow for one piece of paper as a handout. Projects submitted to both the Regional and Countywide Competitions are:

- Bremerton – Washington and 11th Improvements
- Kitsap County – Ridgetop Mickelberry to Myhre
- Kitsap Transit – SR 104 and Bond Road Park and Ride

D. Corridor Updates

- SR 305: The SR 305 corridor study has been completed and turned over to the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) for execution. WSDOT has

contracted with Parametrix for the next phases of this project. A working group meeting is scheduled for April 20 at Poulsbo City Hall.

- SR 16/Gorst: The working group is weighing recommendations, which include adding lanes and replacing 2 culverts.
- SR 104: The initiative has received funding and is coordinating with WSDOT to begin preliminary engineering in the fall.

E. Announcements and Next Steps

- The next TransPOL meeting will be on April 19, 2018.
- The next TransTAC meeting, the Countywide Project Selection Workshop, will be on May 29, 2018.
- TransPOL will have a meeting on May 31. TransTAC attendance is expected to review the Countywide Competition project recommendations.
- The Long Range Ferry Plan Open Houses are being held from April 17-May 17 at various locations. There is also an online comment forum.
- Fast Ferry discussions are underway in Pierce and King Counties.
- Discussions of converting Washington State Ferries' fleet to all-electric vessels are underway.
