C. Recommendations for PlanPOL and KRCC Board

Objective: Develop technical guidance for PlanPOL and the KRCC Board to consider regarding VISION 2050 and other issues.

- Review the "No Action Alternative" population projections for 2050 (page 8) to help prepare policy makers for participating in the development of the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for VISION 2050. Note: While these provide jurisdiction-level extension of the Regional Growth Strategy in VISION 2040 to the year 2050, they are not adopted policy or a substitute for the local target-setting process. VISION 2050 will include growth shares for regional geographies (not individual cities) and for a longer plan horizon than growth targets.
- Answer the following questions:
 - i. What are the linear 2050 growth projections for Kitsap jurisdictions?
 - ii. Given these growth projections, could your jurisdiction's current zoning accept the anticipated growth levels for 2050? See the <u>2014 Buildable Lands Report</u> (web link) or the BLR Executive Summary (page 9).
 - iii. If your jurisdiction cannot accept anticipated growth, what reasonable measures might your jurisdiction employ?
