1. Welcome and Introductions

Sophie Glass, KRCC staff, welcomed LUTAC members to the February 9 meeting. She reviewed the meeting objectives and topics. Attachment A lists the LUTAC members and other presenters in attendance.

Sophie shared that Joe Morrison, Kitsap Economic Development Alliance (KEDA), was unable to attend the meeting, but that he is the point person at KEDA for all matters relating to comprehensive plan development.

2. Old Business

a. Meeting Summary Review: LUTAC members reviewed the December 8 and January 12 meeting summaries. They did not raise any comments or concerns. KRCC staff will post the summaries to the KRCC website.

3. Committee Updates and Work in Progress

- a. Debrief February 7 KRCC Board/LUTAC Study Session: LUTAC members summarized that the KRCC Board directed LUTAC to consider several new criteria regarding housing targets: the role of the military, existing affordable housing inventory, full accounting for housing costs such as utility costs, emphasis on transit, and repurposing single family housing. LUTAC noted that some of these considerations relate more to implementation than allocation setting.
- b. Housing Target Allocation Process:

Commerce's responses to LUTAC's questions: Sophie shared responses from the
Department of Commerce regarding the questions that LUTAC members developed
during the January 12 LUTAC meeting. Commerce's responses are available in the
February 9 LUTAC packet, page 11.

LUTAC members requested that KRCC staff ask Commerce whether in addressing negative numbers Kitsap can increase the total number of housing units it is planning for as a county.

 Presentation of other counties' housing allocation approaches: Sophie provided an overview of the processes Pierce, King, and Snohomish Counties are working through to develop housing allocations.

LUTAC members asked KRCC staff to follow up with Pierce County to ask whether they encountered negative numbers when using Commerce's HAPT.

LUTAC members noted that King County's process for developing housing allocations based on a weighting system is complex and took a significant amount of time.

- Further develop housing allocations, policy considerations, and methodology: LUTAC
 members discussed next steps regarding developing a Kitsap-specific method for
 housing allocations. They discussed the following considerations:
 - Commerce's HAPT assumes 1.98 persons per household for all Kitsap jurisdictions. However, based on the American Community Survey, each jurisdiction in Kitsap has a different persons per household that is higher than 2.
 - Commerce's guidance indicates that for income bands below 120% of area median income, housing types would need to be townhomes, duplexes, triplexes, or multifamily housing types.
 - Allocations that work for all jurisdictions will likely need to be somewhere between the ones in Commerce's Methodology A and Methodology B.
 - It would be problematic to use a weighting approach that incorporates land cost and supportive services because such an approach could perpetuate inequities.

LUTAC members recommended that they consider the potential impact of using different persons per household figures than the one Commerce assumed in order to better adjust for local factors. They identified three options for allocating housing across income bands based on different persons per household assumptions:

- 1. Use Commerce's persons per household assumption of 1.98.
- 2. Adjust Commerce's allocations for each jurisdiction based on each jurisdiction's individual persons per household figure.
- 3. Adjust Commerce's allocations based on an average of each jurisdiction's persons per household figure.

LUTAC requested that KRCC staff work with LUTAC members to calculate adjustments to Commerce's Methodologies A and B based on the persons per household options. At the next LUTAC meeting, LUTAC can discuss the results and determine whether technical consultant support is necessary moving forward.

HB Harper committed to drafting an adjusted Methodology A, once Commerce's final guidance is released, for LUTAC discussion using the following steps:



- 1. Within Methodology A, identify categories that pose issues for each jurisdiction.
- 2. For these cells, average the Methodology A and Methodology B values.
- 3. Calculate the difference between Methodology A and the average of Methodologies A and B.
- 4. At the March 9 LUTAC meeting, discuss a method for distributing that difference throughout the jurisdictions.

LUTAC members requested that Ed Coviello present at the February 23 LUTAC meeting regarding station area planning and Kitsap Transit's Long-Range Transit Plan.

4. Administrative Agenda

a. Meeting Review: Heather Wright suggested holding a future LUTAC meeting in person in order to discuss housing allocations in an in-person environment. LUTAC members recommended holding the March 9 LUTAC meeting in person, with options for members to join virtually if needed. Alison O'Sullivan offered to reserve a space at the Suquamish Tribal Council Chambers, which has hybrid meeting capabilities. To accommodate LUTAC members' schedules, this in-person meeting will be held from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m.

5. Wrap Up

a. Recap: Sophie reviewed the decisions and action items listed in the table above.
