



### GROWTH MANAGEMENT ACT – PROVIDES BASE REQUIREMENTS

RCW 36.70A. I I 0 – Comprehensive Plans – Urban Growth Areas

(2) Based upon the growth management population projection made for the county by the office of financial management, the county and each city within the county shall include areas and densities sufficient to permit the urban growth that is projected to occur in the county or city for the succeeding twenty-year period...As part of this planning process, each city within the county must include areas sufficient to accommodate the broad range of needs and uses that will accompany the projected urban growth including, as appropriate, medical, governmental, institutional, commercial, service, retail, and other nonresidential uses.

## VISION 2050 - HOW DOES IT FIT IN?

- VISION 2050's multicounty planning policies and regional growth strategy further guide how the four-county region grows.
- Allocates growth by Regional Geography
- Growth Management Act and PSRC differences/similarities

- LUTAC meeting since 2021 to develop initial growth targets
- Process in CPP UGA-5 utilized
- Sub-committee meetings by regional geography to develop targets
- Growth target dashboard utilized to coordinate efforts
- Coordination with:
  - PlanPol, Executive Committee, and Board throughout process
  - Meetings with individual jurisdictions
  - Commerce and PSRC to ensure consistency with state law and Vision 2050 requirements
