1. Chair's Welcome

KRCC Chair/Kitsap County Commissioner Rob Gelder welcomed the Executive Committee to the virtual meeting.

2. Committee Updates and Action Items

A. Executive Committee Items

Review the November 16 Executive Committee meeting summary

The November 16 Executive Committee meeting summary was approved as drafted.

Legislative Orientation & Reception debrief

Executive Committee members discussed the Legislative Reception, held on December 2, 2021, via Zoom. Observations included:

- The orientation and reception events both went well. Members received positive feedback from several attendees.
- The panel discussion revealed areas for cooperative action between state and local officials including:
 - Medical facilities siting
 - Desire for a prioritized list of transportation projects
 - Importance of the ferry system
- The virtual format had advantages and may be worth continuing in future years.
 - Virtual session allowed easy participation by eliminating travel time. Two Legislators who have not been able to attend before were able to be part of this year's panel.
 - Virtual format invited more conversational discussion by eliminating the on-stage vs in-audience divide.
 - Not having to rent space and provide refreshments is more cost-effective.
- Some members noted that having a narrower focus allows for deeper discussion on one topic rather than broadly touching several.
- One member suggested starting to plan panel questions earlier next year, perhaps in late summer or early fall. Perhaps convening a group of other KRCC Board members specifically focused on shaping this discussion would allow some members the opportunity to take a new role.

Updated process for approving invoices

The state auditor has indicated they need a form signed by the Chair and Vice Chair each month to show formal approval of the KRCC invoice. KRCC staff will create a form and determine a process for gathering signatures from the Chair and Vice Chair in a way that streamlines the process. The form will be needed beginning with the November 2021 invoice approval and will need to be completed for each month going forward.

Review Chair appointments for Executive Committee for 2022



Kitsap Regional Coordinating Council

Commissioner Mary McClure has agreed to join the Executive Committee as a representative of the Ports for 2022. Commissioner Strakeljahn will continue to serve on the KRCC Executive Board but will not serve on the Executive Committee in 2022, since the Committee needs to stay small to avoid convening a quorum of the Board.

<u>Discussion of Committee Appointments and In-Person v. Hybrid meetings</u>

City members shared their timelines for appointing new committee members and committed to expedite timely committee assignment decisions where possible.

- Bainbridge has a January 11 City Council meeting and is scheduled to appoint committee members by January 25.
- o Poulsbo City Council meets January 19.
- Bremerton has a large turnover this year. They will meet on January 4 to discuss committee
 assignment preferences and will sort out options by the end of that week and should have
 assignments firm by mid-January.

The coordinating group for the Board meetings held on the first Tuesday of each month are talking with each other about when and how meetings might start taking place in person at Bremerton's government center. KRCC staff will need to learn to run the on-site A/V equipment to support hybrid meetings. Timing will depend on the governor's order and when Bremerton decides to open that venue. Committee members shared their jurisdictions current plans for returning to in person or hybrid-option meetings.

- Poulsbo will begin in person meetings in February. The first and third week of the month will be in person. The second week of the month will remain remote. Poulsbo is beginning to use council chambers for public events, but not meeting rooms yet since they are smaller.
- Kitsap County began in-person meetings in July 2021, had some technical hiccups and smoothed them out in August. They are now doing hybrid meetings with testimony in Zoom and in chambers. Kitsap County has been open to outside reservations since summer, but rarely gets requests so far.
- o Bremerton is researching what is working for other jurisdictions for use of rooms by the public or just for government use. They would like to do a hybrid swearing-in ceremony on December 29.
- Port Orchard is updating council chambers to support hybrid events. They are allowing limited access to city hall but are not letting the public attend in person yet.

B. Land Use Items

Review draft guidance and request for information from Board to LUTAC re housing targets

The proposed guidance to LUTAC is that each jurisdiction will calculate housing targets independently on the timeframe that will work for their planning. After housing targets are generated, they would be gathered into an appendix to the Countywide Planning Policies (CPPs).

Poulsbo will be doing their housing targets early in their process and encourages other jurisdictions to make sure they are planning for the infrastructure and housing units needed for anticipated growth. Bainbridge will be looking closely at the Winslow master plan this year, because that is where they anticipate accommodating the most growth.

Dept of Commerce request to present on Behavioral Health Model Ordinance



Kitsap Regional Coordinating Council

The Department of Commerce has asked to give a presentation at a KRCC meeting relating to new model ordinance and toolkit for siting residential behavioral health treatment facilities. Committee members agreed that a presentation would be helpful to understand the structure and thinking behind this new section to the Revised Code of Washington (RCW). The Executive Committee suggests inviting a 10-minute presentation at the February 1 Board meeting. The presentation should cover the thinking behind this new guidance (i.e., what problem are they trying to solve), and presenters should come with examples relevant to the Kitsap region.

• Review draft January 13 LUTAC meeting agenda

The County long range planning group is short-staffed due to staffing transitions. The County will have different participation on this committee in 2022. Angie Silva took a position with Pierce County. Eric Baker is expected to attend meetings in 2022.

Ratifying Countywide Planning Policies (CPPs)

Bainbridge will vote on ratifying CPPs this evening at the Dec 14 council meeting. Poulsbo has already ratified as have the other two cities. Port Orchard council voted unanimously to move the whole document forward. The Suquamish tribe has ratified. CPPs will move forward as three Cities and the County have ratified.

C. Transportation Items

Review draft January 13 TransTAC meeting agenda

The Committee requests that TransTAC meeting agendas shift to the outline format used by all other KRCC committees, rather than the table format in use in this draft.

• Review draft January 20 TransPOL meeting agenda

Updates on Federal Transportation Competition will take most of the meeting. Under Legislative Updates topic, ask whether the group would like to form or revive something like the West Sound Alliance, and ask how KRCC can help jurisdictions move forward in the next legislative session. This alliance would focus on the bigger appropriations available at the state level with an eye for addressing corridor gaps, not on the current federal money competition. Legislators assume lists are organized by priority. KRCC needs to clarify with legislators that the project lists are each organized by its own jurisdiction, not across the region.

Members said that the TransPOL meeting should include an orientation element for new members to give them the context they need to understand before engaging in decisions about whether to impose caps on the number or size of applications for the federal competition, including

- o the limitations of the federal money that comes to the Kitsap region
- o the \$6-8 million that comes from the Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP)
- the larger pool of funding that comes from the state level to fund larger projects like key corridor gaps
- PSRC's scoring system for evaluating the federal competition applications

Review Approved 2022 KRCC Workplan, Budget, and Dues

KRCC staff will draft dues letters to go out in January. Chair Gelder will sign and send the letters to any jurisdiction with delinquent dues; KRCC staff will send the rest.

Triangle Associates contractor evaluation survey report

KRCC staff would find discussion of the annual survey helpful in shaping their future work. Commissioner Gelder will send out the annual evaluation survey summary to board members so that all KRCC Board members will see the results. The Executive Committee will review the summary and discuss it at the January meeting.

Other topics - Invitation from KEDA

Members received an email invitation from Kitsap Economic Development Alliance (KEDA) about a strategy preview business meeting about Gorst region. This is separate from the Gorst Coalition's coordination.

Approve Triangle Associates November 2021 Invoice

November was a larger level of effort than anticipated. December will be smaller since there is not a Board meeting packet to produce for January. As a result, the 2021 carryforward might not be as large as previously estimated.



Questions were raised about whether to put the KRCC budget into the Workday program at the County. KRCC's task-based budgeting does not align well with the County's line-item accounting, so input would be labor-intensive. Chair Ashby recommended that KRCC invoices are broken out sufficiently and it does not seem necessary to convert it to a different system and input at that level of detail.

The motion to approve November 2021 invoice of \$ 29,532.34 passed without objection or abstention.
